Welcome visitors!

If you're visiting with us today, please take note of the following items.

Theology and Doctrine: St. David's is a Protestant church, standing in the tradition of the Reformation era. We belong to the Communion of Reformed Evangelical Churches (CREC), and our officers subscribe to the Westminster Confession. When the word "catholic" is used in our creeds, it is a reference to the universal body of Christ, not to any one denomination.

Liturgy: Our worship is based on heavenly worship as depicted in Scripture. This is how the universal church has worshiped historically. Everyone has a part to play in worship, so we encourage you to participate by following along in your bulletin.

The Lord's Supper: We celebrate the Lord's Supper (communion, the eucharist) every week, which is the eating of bread and drinking of wine. All faithful, baptized trinitarians (including children) are invited to partake with us.

Nursery: We encourage all of God's people to worship together as one body of Christ (adults and children), so we do not provide Children's Church during worship. However, a nursery room is available if your child becomes restless. It is located in the Community Center library. At the back of the sanctuary: walk down the steps, follow the hallway, and turn left. Audio-feed is available.

Sunday School: Immediately after worship, there will be a brief time for fellowship, then a Sunday School class (all ages) will be held in the sanctuary. Sunday School is an informal time where we have Q&A and biblical or topical lessons.

Fellowship lunch: On the second Sunday of every month, after Sunday School, we share a potluck meal together.

Singing and Prayer: On the last Sunday of every month, instead of Sunday School we have a singing and prayer service. This is a time for us to practice singing and learn new songs, as well as share prayer requests and pray for one another.

Restrooms: Restrooms (with changing stations) are located in the hallway near the parking lot entrance.




